1. **Library Catalog** – check the library’s online catalog to determine if a textbook, journal, reserve item, or other resource material is available in the library. Many our subscription journals are available both in print and electronic format.
2. **UCHC Database Page** – 200+ database sources (Pubmed, Web of Science, MD Consult, etc.)
3. **UCHC E-Textbooks Page** – 180+ online textbooks available (Harrison’s , Robbins, etc..)
4. **UCHC E-Journals Page** – 2,800 e-titles available (NEJM, JAMA, etc..)
5. **PDA Resources** – information to productivity applications and resources for your PDA

DATABASES

eMedicine

Nearly 10,000 physician authors and editors contribute to the eMedicine Clinical Knowledge Base, which contains articles on 7,000 diseases and disorders. The evidence-based content, updated regularly, provides the latest practice guidelines in 59 medical specialties. eMedicine's professional content undergoes 4 levels of physician peer review plus an additional review by a PharmD prior to publication. eMedicine Clinical Knowledge Base contains 30,000 multimedia files and features the largest online repository of medical education credits for physicians, nurses, and optometrists.

Lexi-Comp

Comprehensive drug information including FDA drug alerts and recalls, internationally available drugs, natural products, and poisoning and toxicology. Also includes laboratory tests values, diagnostic procedures, physician's guide to internal and laboratory medicine, and exposure levels to nuclear, biological, and chemical agents.

Pubmed (Medline)

PubMed provides access to bibliographic information, which is drawn primarily from Medline. Medline indexes over 4,600 medical journals from 1966. PubMed also provides access and links to the integrated molecular biology databases included in NCBI's Entrez retrieval system.
